Communication

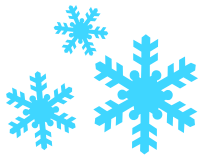
-Need more ways of getting information to the parents about Edmund Knighton's visit

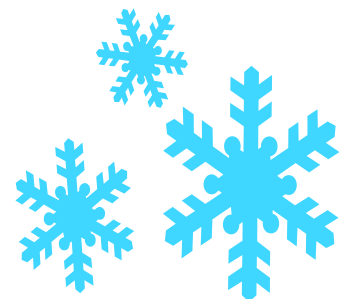
