Once again, Prescott Alternative Transportation (PAT) has put together a whole month of events/activities in celebration of bikes as clean, healthy, economical - and just plain fun! - recreation and transportation. Bad economy got you down? Rejoice in getting Infinite Miles per Gallon from your trusty bicycle!

Here are some family-friendly event highlights; all events are free and open to the public, unless otherwise stated:

EACH WEDNESDAY DURING BIKE MONTH IS WALK-N-ROLL WEDNESDAY: Kids – walk or ride your bike to school! Parents – join your children! See how easy it is to get some great exercise, reduce gas costs, and reduce pollution and carbon emissions.

APRIL 24 – ‘Kidical Mass’, 5:30pm, meet on northside of Courthouse Plaza. This will be a family-friendly community ride through town to end up in Granite Creek Park for frozen treats!

APRIL 25 – The Whiskey Off-Road Endurance Ride. While children are obviously not a part of the race, it’s always fun to watch all the riders come back into town! After the race there is a free concert for the entire community at the Courthouse Plaza by Roger Clyne & the Peacemakers. Go to www.epicrides.com for more details.

APRIL 26 - Bike Lane Stencil Day, 12pm, meet at the PAT office. Help the City’s public works department in repainting bike lane symbols through town. Fun and important work! All are welcome; refreshments provided.

MAY 12 – ‘Bike the Beat’, 6pm, meet in Granite Creek Park (just below Staples). Join Prescott Police Department’s mountain bike patrol on their ‘beat’. Definitely an interesting ride through the streets, alleys, and trails of Prescott!

MAY 15 – Ride to Work with the Mayor, 7am, meet in the parking lot of the old Fry’s shopping center (west Gurley St. as it turns into Thumb Butte Rd.). Join Mayor Wilson in making this the largest community bike ride ever! Bring the kids, bring your neighbors and friends! Police escorts ensure the safety of all; free breakfast treats await everyone at City Hall.
