# Building PRESCOTT PARK

FOR THE CHILDREN OF PRESCOTT'S SISTER CITY, SUCHITOTO, EL SALVADOR



In 2007, the City of Prescott and Suchitoto, El Salvador joined together as "Sister Cities." A "Sister City" relationship can be whatever the cities wish it to be. The leaders of the City of Prescott have visited Suchitoto to look at ways to help each other. One way the City of Prescott is helping is by rebuilding the only public park in Suchitoto so that children in their community can again play and have fun! The original park, soon to be named "Prescott Park", was destroyed in the early 2000's by war and an earthquake.

Our school is one of the schools in Prescott that is working with the Sister City organization to raise the \$14,000 needed to rebuild the park.

- Opportunity:** Have fun and contribute to pay for a park at Prescott's Sister City – Suchitoto, El Salvador. And, have a piece of you in another country!
- Why:** The over ½ acre children's park was destroyed by earthquake and war in the early 2000's.
